YEAR 11 TASTE OF SIXTH FORM

Dear Year 11 pupil,

I am writing to inform you of the arrangements for the **Taste of Sixth Form Day** which is taking place on **Friday 10**th **November 2023.**

This taster day in Year 11 is where you can experience what Sixth Form lessons will be like. I would encourage you to try a range of subjects. This will build upon your experience in Year 10 where you studied sixth form subjects but had a 'bite-size' session. For some pupils, you will have the opportunity of visiting local college providers to consider their apprenticeship provision.

For those on site, you will have the full use of the facilities at lunch and break time.

You will be given access to your choices via your Year 11 Teams group on **Monday 16th October 2023** to make your choices for subjects to attend that day. We will do our best to accommodate your choices but, in some instances, classes might end up full so we will operate a **first come first served basis** so you would be advised to complete as soon as possible. The deadline for submitting your choices is **Monday 23rd October 2023**.

We would expect you to dress as a Sixth Former so there is no need to wear your usual uniform and you must come equipped to learn with a bag, pens and paper.

All invited Year 11 pupils are expected to attend as it is a normal school day, taking full advantage of this provision to help you make informed choices regarding your progression after Year 11. All the staff look forward to teaching you on what we are sure will be an informative and productive day.

REMEMBRANCE DAY

Remembrance Day is the day traditionally put aside to remember all those who have given their lives in war. On this day, people across the world pause to reflect on the sacrifices made by our brave service men and women.

The date is significant as it was when the Armistice was signed to end the fighting in World War 1. After World War 1, it was decided that due to the length and destruction of the conflict, and the huge number of casualties, that every 11th November would be remembered to reflect on the sacrifices the soldiers made. Initially it was known as Armistice Day, but after World War 2, it was renamed as Remembrance Day. As history has progressed and other conflicts have occurred, it has become a day to remember lost ones from all wars across the world.

To show our respect, we will be marking Remembrance Day with a 2-minute silence at 11am on Friday 10th November to remember those who have served and continue to serve in the armed forces. We will also be taking a couple of students to lay a wreath at the cenotaph in Rainhill Village. If any student is a member of the armed services cadets (or equivalent), they are welcome to wear their cadet uniform on Friday 10th November. Pupils are encouraged to wear poppies as a sign of remembrance.

Poppies are available to purchase from our Reception desk to support The Royal British Legion Poppy Appeal. Any donation is appreciated. Thank you.

Meet our Head Students

<u> House Representatives</u>

It has been a great start to the new academic year for the House system at Rainhill High School. The house system aims to promote participation in wider school life and celebrate the achievements of all students. Each student is part of one of Five Houses, whose names are all connected to the famous Rainhill Trials:

- Perseverance (Green House)- This House is named after the first steam locomotive that took part in the Rainhill Trials. The Head of House is Mr Sharman.
- Rocket (White House)- The Rocket was the most advanced steam engine of its day. It was built for the Rainhill Trials. The Head of House is Miss Burgess.
- Sans Pareil (Yellow House) was a steam locomotive built by Timothy Hackworth which took part in the 1829 Rainhill Trials. The Head of House is Mr Cowley.
- Stephenson (Purple House)- Named after Robert Stephenson, one of the most famous English civil engineers and locomotive designers of the nineteenth century. The Head of House for Stephenson is Mr McNer.
- Braithwaite (Orange House)- Named after John Braithwaite, who was co-creator of 'Novelty'- an
 early steam locomotive built to take part in the Rainhill Trials. The Head of House for Braithwate is
 Miss Wignall.

During Half-Term 1, Heads of Houses have been a presence during Tutor Time, celebrating student achievement with postcards of praise being awarded to those students in each year group for the Highest Number of Attitude to Learning (ATL1) scores in their year group within their House. Our first faculty events took place with MFL hosting a European themed Bake-Off Sale for McMillan Cancer support and a European Landmark competition. In addition, we recruited a House Representative from each tutor group who will play an important role in the ongoing promotion and development of the House system, including at future events.

We look forward to the next half-term in which we will continue to celebrate achievement each week, as well as our Christmas Charity appeal events, more details of which will be shared with students soon.

Your child's annual flu vaccination is now due.

This vaccination is recommended to help protect your child against flu.

Flu can be an unpleasant illness and sometimes causes serious complications. Vaccinating your child will also help protect more vulnerable family and friends by preventing the spread of flu.

The vaccination is free and is a quick and simple spray up the nose. Even if your child had it last year, it is recommended to have the flu vaccine again this year. The immunisation team will be coming into school to deliver on Tuesday, 5th December 2023.

There are growing concerns across St Helens about the increasing use of a drug called ketamine by young people (may also be called "ket", "k", "Kenny").

The reason why people are worried is because it is causing real serious harms to young people's physical and mental health. These harms can happen very quickly, over a matter of weeks in some instances and we are seeing young people attend local hospitals or their GP surgery with problems such as bladder and urinary problems, including inability to pass urine or having blood in their urine, stomach pains or unable to go to the toilet. It can be very addictive, even over a short period of time, and people who use ketamine can very quickly feel the need to start using more and more and their use can become out of control.

Ketamine powder may also be being used with other drugs or with alcohol. This could cause very serious effects and could even lead to a fatality.

Ketamine is known as a "disassociate anaesthetic" – it can reduce awareness and sensitivity to pain as well as inhibiting movement. It can produce the effects of being disorientated, cause hallucinations, feelings of euphoria, limbs can feel heavy and people may be unable to speak properly. In higher doses it can cause out of body experiences (known as a "k-hole"). The effects may be different for different people depending on how much they have taken and if they have used with other drugs or alcohol.

Because of its anaesthetic properties, people who use ketamine could often injure themselves without realising as their ability to feel pain is reduced.

Ketamine is usually sold as a white/beige powder that users will sniff. This can also cause damage to their nose and nasal passages, including nose bleeds, soft tissue damage, holes.







By law, ketamine is a class B drug. If someone is found by the police to be in possession of ketamine they could be fined or up to 5 years in prison. Dealing (selling/supplying, even to friends) a class B drug could result in a prison sentence of up to 14 years.

Criminal gangs will often groom and "recruit" young people to sell drugs for them, there are strong links to child exploitation, and we are worried that the children being exploited are selling drugs like ketamine to other young people.

LETTER FROM MERSEYSIDE POLICE



Letter to parents and guardians from Merseyside Police re. Halloween and Bonfire Night

We are writing to all parents and guardians to ask for your help over the upcoming Halloween and Bonfire Night period.

We want everyone to have fun and we'll be working hard to keep you safe, but we need your help:

Know where your children are

- Encourage kids to go to local events that are being organised, or try a spooky film together
- If your children are going out (particularly on the 30th and 31st of October), make sure you
 know where they're going. If possible, drop them off and pick them up
- Don't let your children hang around the street
- If they're going somewhere local walk there with them
- · Have an agreed time when they need to be home
- Don't buy fireworks or eggs and flour for them, and don't let them take it out of the house

Know the risks

- Throwing things at cars, buses, shops and houses can hurt people drivers might swerve if
 they get distracted and cause a crash, or someone might get hurt by broken glass (and
 scratched paintwork can be very expensive to fix)
- Getting into trouble with the police can lead to a criminal record, which means not being
 able to go on holiday to countries like the USA, and not being able to do certain jobs
- Messing around with fireworks is dangerous some burn as hot as 1,200 degrees hot
 enough to melt glass and cause serious or fatal injuries

Know the law

If a young person under the age of 16 commits any of the offences below, the parent/guardian will have to pay the fine.

- A person under the age of 16 can be arrested and fined if found with an unlit firework
- A person under the age of 16 can also be arrested and fined if they throw or light a firework or make a bonfire
- A person under the age of 16 can be arrested and fined for throwing things like eggs, flour, paint or other objects at people, vehicles or property

Thank you for your help and support. By working together, we can keep your children safe this Halloween and Bonfire Night.
