VALUES



Learning is at the heart of everything we do. Our very broad, carefully constructed curriculum builds essential, powerful knowledge that encourages children to think critically in all subjects. The curriculum is taught by a highly committed, expert team of teachers. Children's understanding is checked in the classroom through regular informal assessments, and through three key assessment points over the academic year. We have high expectations of our pupils and support everyone to access the curriculum. We expect pupils to work hard and do their best. We support healthy lifestyles and competition through PE; we have a real passion and strength in both visual and performing arts. We are proud to be the Town Sports champions in every age range in 2022 and we hold a number of Town Sports records on both the track and field events; we have been the overall champions for the past five years. Teams play at national level in both football and rugby and we regularly win competitions for art and photography. A number of our students are classed as 'elite performers' in their chosen sporting field.

Beyond their formal education, we help to ensure our children understand their social responsibilities and their contribution to their school community and the wider world. We expect all of our students to demonstrate care, compassion and respect for others.





The curriculum and its delivery are at the heart of learning. We recognise that students have varying needs and starting points; all will receive a broad and balanced curriculum, rich in essential knowledge and experiences. Everyone will be able to access the curriculum and inturn, we have high expectation of everyone.

Our curriculum is ambitious, and is carefully planned to build knowledge, understanding and skills over time:

- Pupils are required to recall and apply prior knowledge to retain their learning over time.
- Literacy skills are embedded in lessons to ensure students develop their vocabulary and develop reading or writing skills from every starting point.
- Pupils are required to apply their learning to real life problems and scenarios.
- Pupils are required to develop their understanding of the wider world through the taught curriculum, enrichment and extra-curricular activities.
- Assessment is the method by which we gauge how well a pupil has grasped the key knowledge. Assessment takes place in some form, drawing on a wide range of strategies, every lesson. More formal marked assessments take place every half term.

KEY STAGE 3

Years 7, 8 & 9

All students follow the national curriculum at KS3, ensuring a broad balanced range of subjects; literacy skills are embedded within the taught curriculum. Learning is carefully planned and paced to ensure that key knowledge and key skills are developed well and form a strong base for future learning at KS4 and KS5 and life beyond the school gate. Feedback and assessment inform future learning and build pupils confidence.

KEY STAGE 4

Year 10 & Year 11

Students continue to study a broad range of subjects over the two years, following their options choices at the end of Year 9. Students make four choices beyond the core curriculum to allow them to choose subjects of particular interest to them.

We encourage students to keep their options academic and have a high proportion (well above national) following an EBACC pathway. Other pathways are available and students receive the necessary support, advice and guidance to make choices that reflect both their ability, interests and their goals in life.

KEY STAGE 5

Year 12 & Year 13

Rainhill Sixth offers a wide range of A Level, Applied General and Vocational courses. Students opt for their subjects, based on their attainment, preferences and target destinations. Routes through Rainhill Sixth are very much bespoke to our students' needs; vocational qualifications, for example, can be studied alongside A-Levels.

In addition to subject choices, all students follow a PHSCE programme that reflects the needs and ambitions of Sixth Form students, including work experience. Rainhill High School wants its students to leave as happy, confident and successful learners. In their time with us, we help them to understand how to feel safe and respected and to be able to develop at their own pace. Our strong and sizeable pastoral team includes teaching and specialist support staff. In addition, there are teams specialising in attendance, safeguarding and counselling. We have a new, purpose built SEND base that offers bespoke interventions.

Every student is different and over time may need a little extra help and support to build their confidence, resilience and personal skills to thrive in the wider world.

We have a strong pastoral team to support your child in navigating their way through their school life. Support for your child is comprehensive, nurturing and specific to individual needs that arise.

Parents can access a lot of information through our interactive Synergy system.

Recognising when students excel is also a priority for us. We pride ourselves on the range of rewards and awards that are available, including house points, achievers and house assemblies, as well as postcards home. The school encourages and enables students to influence the school on a daily basis through its leadership opportunities and the School Parliament. We encourage them to invest in their school and continue its success. The Rainhill Student Parliament puts student voice at the heart of key decision making in our school. Each form group has an elected representative and they bring the views of the form to each Parliament session. Our Student Leadership Team (including the Head and Deputy Head students) chair the Parliamentary sessions and each session ends with a vote on a key issue. The issues we have tackled so far include which charities we should support and how best to support young people with their mental health.

Rainhill Sixth is on the same site as our main school, however has a different identity and atmosphere to the highly successful 11-16 school, giving a whole new experience. Our strength is our size, being large enough to offer a full yet diverse curriculum and small enough to focus and support our students in academic studies and future progression. We have excellent destinations with our students going on to the best universities, apprenticeships and performing conservatoires in the country. We provide our students with the tailored support and guidance in their studies allowing them

to succeed at the highest levels. The Rainhill Sixth 'super-curriculum' programme is wide reaching and ensures that our students have every opportunity to build a range of first-hand experiences, develop skills and self-confidence to make their next steps at age 18. The programme includes bespoke work experience, enterprise, preparation for University, support with applications and a range of speakers and visits to support our students' studies and knowledge of the wider world. We actively encourage leadership opportunities, from national campaigns to local charity work. We

actively encourage participation in the Duke of Edinburgh Award and many of our students go on to achieve silver and gold awards.

Destinations for our Rainhill Sixth leavers include undergraduate courses at Oxford, Cambridge and many Russell Group Universities, top class performing arts institutions like the Italia Conti Conservatoire and Level 3 Apprenticeships at Whiston Hospital and the RAF.
