<b>Noughts and Crosses</b>		In an alternative world the issues of racism are tackled in a society which has only two types of people: "noughts" and "crosses". This novel is about friendship that goes beyond these barriers. The sequel set a generation later is also an absolute knock out.
<b>Basilisk</b>	NM Browne	A wonderful blend of myths, history and archaeology in this great novel set in the caves of a dark world.
<b>Innocent</b>	Anne Cassidy	Great junior novel from Cassidy, as Charlie tries to prove the innocence of her older brother Brad.
<b>Silverfin</b>	Charlie Higson	The first in a popular new series about James (Young Bond Series) Bond when he was still at school.
<b>Outsiders</b>	SE Hinton	Stunning study of hate, violence, loyalty and friendship set in the violent gang-lands of New York. One of the very best teenage novels ever written.
<b>Wind on Fire Trilogy</b>	William Nicholson	Breathtaking trilogy about a society governed by exams. But what happens when you rebel? Read to find out. A truly excellent trilogy.
<b>Hatchet</b>	Gary Paulsen	Thrilling adventure about the survival of a 12 year old boy after a plane crash. Also has great sequels.
<b>Survival</b>	Chris Ryan,	The ultra tough and realistic novels of Chris Ryan are a must for youngsters seeking excitement and thrills. This "Alpha Force" novel is the start of a gripping new series.

<b>Stargirl</b>	Jerry Spinelli	Brilliant and brave novel about a teenager daring to be different in an American high school. Highly recommended.
<b>Double Act</b>	Jacqueline Wilson	Twin girls have trouble with their new stepmum. Another great book by Jacqueline Wilson.
<b>Face</b>	Benjamin Zephaniah	Realistic story of how a boy is disfigured in a car accident and has to start living a new life with his disfigurement.

<b>Jane Eyre</b>	Charlotte Bronte	Jane falls in love with her rich employer, only to find out he has a dark secret....Classic stuff that has thrilled generations.
<b>A Christmas Carol</b>	Charles Dickens	Read about Scrooge yourself; much better than any film you may have seen of it.
<b>Adventures of Sherlock Holmes</b>	Conan Doyle	This is a great introduction to detective stories. Many of the best Holmes stories are in this collection.

<b>Adventures of Tom Sawyer &amp; Adventures of Huckleberry Finn</b>	Mark Twain	Adventure, freedom and excitement are in abundance in these two novels set in the American deep south during the great depression. Highly recommended
<b>Walkabout</b>	J. Vance Marshall	In the Australian desert, two children, survivors of an air crash, make their journey across the harsh landscape, aided by an Aboriginal boy on "walkabout".
<b>The Time Machine</b>	HG Wells	SF novel about time travel and the possible consequences.

<b>Sea of Trolls</b>	Nancy Farmer	A sweeping Viking novel with 2 young children being held captive by the evil half-troll king Ivar the Boneless.
<b>Narnia series</b>	CS Lewis	Perhaps the ultimate battle between Good and Evil? Classic tale of children trying to awaken an animal world from eternal winter. 7 books in series.
<b>Shadow of the Minotaur</b>	Alan Gibbons	Computer game virtual reality becomes reality in this compulsive read. Highly recommended.
<b>Eragon &amp; Eldest</b>	Chris Paolini	Wonderful quest first-novel by a 16 year old author whose main character begins his destiny is to be a Dragon Rider.
<b>His Dark Materials</b>	Philip Pullman	One of the most brilliant children's trilogies of the last 20 years. Has more surprises, scares and twists that you can cope with!
<b>Mortal Engines</b>	Philip Reeves	Superb fantasy novel where moving cities trawl the globe. Tom and Hester are thrown from their beloved "London" and try to get back on board. A highly original read.

<b>Red Velvet</b>	Carol Hedges	Nasty things begin to happen to Elly when she finds the skeleton of a dead girl wearing a red dress in an old house.
<b>Breathe: A ghost Story</b>	Cliff McNish	A true ghost story. The kind that says its cold fingers on you grips tight and doesn't let you go under the last pages have been turned. Wonderfully spine chilling.
<b>Witch Child Sorcoress</b>	Celia Rees	Interesting read about the daughter of a woman accused of being a witch in 18th century England. Beautifully written and asks many intelligent questions and now followed by a great sequel.
<b>My Swordhand is Singing</b>	Marcus Sedgwick	Chilling vampire tale set in 17th Century Europe, inspired by the original Transylvanian Vampire folk tales. Scary stuff!
<b>The Mirror Image Ghost</b>	Catherine Storr	Now classic suspense horror novel. Wonderfully written with a timeless appeal.

<b>Looking For JJ</b>	Anne Cassidy	JJ is released from prison, 10 years after killing a friend, & tries to live with her new identity. Truly amazing teenage thriller.
<b>Wolf</b>	Gillian Cross	Brilliant multi-layered family drama about hidden secrets and Cassy's father – who nobody ever speaks about.
<b>Curious Incident of the Dog in the Night-Time</b>	Mark Haddon	A genuine cult classic. A boy with autism investigates the "murder" of his neighbour's dog. Funny, original and moving.

<b>Girl Interrupted</b>	Suzanne Kaysen	Autobiographical novel about a young woman in a psychiatric hospital in the late 1960s.
<b>Walkabout</b>	J. Vance Marshall	Two abandoned British children try to survive the harsh landscape, of Australia aided by an Aboriginal boy on "walkabout".
<b>Tomorrow: When the War Began Series</b>	John Marsden	Australia is invaded by an unknown enemy in this stunning, violent, thriller series recently made into a film.
<b>Life of Pi</b>	Yann Martel	Very accessible Booker Prize winner concerning oceanic, fantasy like, wanderings of a boy stranded at sea on a raft with some animals.
<b>I Capture the Castle</b>	Dodie Smith	Great novel of first love, with an eccentric family of sisters living in a dilapidated castle in pre-war Ireland.
<b>The Prime of Miss Jean Brodie</b>	Muriel Spark	Beautifully crafted short novel about the teacher of a clique of talented girls in the 1930s, in a posh Edinburgh school.
<b>Secret Diary of Adrian Mole</b>	Sue Townsend	Classic series of diaries featuring 13 year old Adrian and his obsession with the lovely Pandora. Very funny start to a lengthy series.
<b>The Book Thief</b>	Marcus Zusak	One of my favourite ever books. Death takes an interest in an orphaned little girl. This Nazi Germany set novel is seeped deep in humanity and compassion. One of my favourite ever books.

<b>Tarzan of the Apes</b>	Edgar Rice Burroughs	It's time for a Tarzan revival! A baby boy is left stranded in the African jungle after his parents die and is raised by apes.
<b>Brave New World</b>	Aldous Huxley	Huxley's nightmare vision of the future. A challenging read.
<b>Casino Royale</b>	Ian Fleming	Discover Bond in the first of the classic thriller/spy novels.
<b>Animal Farm</b>	George Orwell	The animals of Manor Farm find the pigs as nasty as the humans. One of the 20th centuries leading political satires.
<b>Frankenstein</b>	Mary Shelley	The fable of the scientist who creates a man-monster, only to see it inflict murder on the human race.
<b>Dracula</b>	Bram Stoker	Classic tale of the Count. Nothing like most of the films made in its name; and far more frightening, creepy and gothic.
<b>War of the Worlds</b>	HG Wells	The Martians invade in this classic invasion story.
<b>Day of the Triffids</b>	John Wyndam	Gripping novel about paranoia and the Earth being invaded by seemingly invincible plants. A great introduction to 1950s SF.

<b>iBoy</b>	Kevin Brooks	Vicious novel about a boy with a shattered iphone stuck in his brain resulting in special powers... Warning, this is no fairy-tale.
<b>Inside my Head</b>	Jim Carrington	Riveting tale of school bullying told from three points of view; the bully's friend, the victim and girl in the middle.
