As part of our Year 10 to Year 11 Transition programme, we welcomed Richard McCann to the school this week. Richard led an assembly and worked with small groups of pupils throughout the day, before speaking for staff after school.

Richard's story is inspirational; as a five-year-old, his world was torn apart when his mother, Wilma McCann, became the first victim of the Yorkshire Ripper, Peter Sutcliffe. His life after this was marked with tragedy, trauma and a period of dabbling with drugs and prison. However, he is now living proof of the ability we all 'can' achieve whatever we want to do in life; as a motivational speaker and family man, he has delivered presentations around the world sharing his 'iCan' approach and helping young people to overcome adversity and find their voice with confidence.

Our Year 10 students thoroughly enjoyed the assembly, and feedback from the workshops was positive too as our pupils were challenged to do something they thought they would never be able to attempt.

Further transition activities will follow in the next few weeks as we support our Year 10 students to move to Year 11 with the tenacity, grit and determination to be the best that they can be.



YEAR 10 TASTE OF SIXTH FORM

This includes those who have been adopted, are under Special Guardianship or kinship care arrangements, those living with birth parents and those who are in foster care. Walking Together provides tailormade therapeutic packages of support to children and their families/carers. We provide regular therapeutic parenting training programmes to parents and carers and support to professionals through advice, consultation and training.	Parents, Carers and young people.	Theraplay is a child and family play based therapy which enhances the security of attachments between adult and child and builds on the emotional connection thereby building trust, confidence and self-esteem. Theraplay is based on the natural patterns of playful, healthy interactions between a parent and an infant, and sessions involve a child and parent playing simple connecting games together. Through this process the child experiences joyful engagement, internalises positive messages about themselves and learns to let go, relax and build trust in parents. Theraplay helps children accept deep care, attention and nurture from their parents/carers and this enables them to heal early hurts and fill unmet needs. Theraplay for professionals can provide key skills to help build positive relationships with children, help with peer relationships, and help build self-esteem and feelings of safety within the classroom and when reintroducing professional involvement post COVID. Theraplay is great at supporting positive connections and provides practical ways to support families both face to face and virtually.





YEAR 12 LEARNING PROGRAMME – ASSESSMENT WEEK 3

Friday 18th June to Thursday 24th June 2021 (inclusive)

From Friday 18th June to Thursday 24th June 2021 (inclusive), all students in Year 12 will be undertaking assessments in the subjects they are currently studying. For both A-level and BTEC subjects, these assessments will be based on past paper questions and indeed complete papers, and will be taken under exam conditions to best prepare your son/daughter for final examinations in May/June 2022.

Please see below the exam timetable so your son/daughter is aware of when their examinations take place. All morning exams will start as soon as possible at 9:00am. It is vital that your son/daughter reports to the Arts Theatre at 8:50 am to ensure we have a 9:00am start.

Afternoon examinations commence at 1:10pm. Your son/daughter should report to the Arts Theatre immediately from form-time.

Please could you encourage and support your son/daughter to prepare thoroughly for these exams as they will give them a good indication of the progress they have made to date and whether they will be allowed to progress into Year 13.

The Sixth Form will be providing revision guidance sessions during tutorial periods to ensure your son/daughter can prepare effectively for these important exams. In addition, there is an expectation that your son/daughter will attend their study+ sessions and use this time to effectively prepare.

CORONAVIRUS INFORMATION AND GUIDANCE

COVID-19 TESTING

Dear Parent/Carer,

You have no doubt heard much in the media regarding the Delta variant of COVID-19, which is pushing up infection numbers across the UK, particularly in some neighbouring counties.

Whilst we are encouraged to hear that the link between infection and hospitalisation appears to have been broken by the vaccination drive, we would nevertheless reiterate the **importance of continuing with twice** weekly testing and reporting the results of those tests via the process outlined later in this newsletter.

If you would like your child to be tested, by a trained member of staff, at school instead of at home then please email your child/children's name and form to covid@rainhillhighschool.org.uk and let them know that testing takes place on a Monday and Thursday morning between 8:15am and 8:50am in our test centre (Gym). You do not need to await a confirmation email, once you have informed us you would like your child to be tested at school, then they may attend the test centre at the aforementioned times.

COVID-19 TESTING FOR STUDENTS

Testing of students

- Students should continue to self-test twice per week and follow the guidance below regarding reporting your result.
- If you would prefer your child's testing to be done in school then please email covid@rainhillhighschool.org.uk starting their name and form.
- Comprehensive guidance on self-testing is contained in the 'Instructions for Use' leaflet, which
 comes with the test kit.
- LFD test kits for students will be replenished every 3 x weeks they will be handed out in form time
 and should only be used by the student they are handed to; family members are able to get test kits
 from local testing centres and pharmacies.

RESULTS OF LFD COVID TEST

If negative -

- You need to report the outcome of the test via <u>testregister.co.uk/login</u>
- You can continue to attend school (work).

If positive -

- You need to report the outcome of the test via <u>testregister.co.uk/login</u>
- You will need to inform school and self-isolate in line with the stay-at- home guidance.
- Your household members must isolate for 10 days as well.
- You will also need to arrange a polymerase chain reaction (PCR) test to confirm the result. If this PCR
 test result is negative, and you have no symptoms of COVID-19, you and your household can stop
 isolating.





Why take part?

Taking part in testing is voluntary and all students will be able to attend school/Sixth Form whether they take part in testing or not. We would strongly encourage all students to take part. Testing at home will allow your child and other students to attend school/Sixth Form as safely as possible. CONTACT TESTING

Rainhill High School and Sixth Form will be taking part in a new study called "Daily Contact Testing" which is being run by the Department for Health and Social Care through NHS Test and Trace.

Normally, when we find a person in a school or college has COVID-19, the whole group of people that have been in close contact with that person have to go home and self-isolate for 10 days to stop the virus spreading. This can mean lots of people miss time in school or college, but it is important to do this to protect the other people in school and at home.

This study will test if students and staff can continue to come to school safely after they have been in close contact with a person who is positive for COVID-19, by testing them daily for 7 days with rapid tests. Each day the test is negative **they will be able to take part in school activities only**, they will need to continue self-isolating when not at school. Prevention measures intended to reduce transmission – LFD is an additional tool that contributes to reducing risk.

COVID ISOLATION - UPDATE

The person who has COVID – isolates for 10 days starting the day after symptoms started or, in the absence of symptoms, the day after the positive test.

Non-Household 'Contacts' – isolates for 10 x days starting the day after the last time the person was in contact with the 'infected person' during their infectious period.

Guidance for contacts of people with confirmed coronavirus (COVID-19) infection who do not live with the person

Stay at home: guidance for households with possible or confirmed coronavirus (COVID-19) infection

FACEMASKS

The Government has updated its guidance regarding facemasks, which takes effect from Monday 17th May.

"From 17th May, in line with Step 3 of the roadmap, face coverings will no longer be recommended for pupils in classrooms or communal areas in all schools. Face coverings will also no longer be recommended for staff in classrooms. In all schools we continue to recommend that face coverings should be worn by staff and visitors in situations outside of classrooms where social distancing is not possible (for example, when moving around in corridors and communal areas)."

Regarding transport to and from school - "Children and young people aged 11 and over must still wear a face covering on public transport. In accordance with advice from PHE, they must also wear a face covering when travelling on dedicated transport to secondary school or college. This does not apply to children and young people who are exempt from wearing face coverings."
