YEAR 13 RESULTS DAY 2021 - PLANS AND TIMESLOTS

Dear Year 13 Parents,

We are looking forward to seeing your son/daughter on Results Day.

To ensure we keep everyone safe and can offer appropriate support to your son/daughter, we are asking them to book into a timeslot to collect their results.

They will be able to find out from the UCAS website on 'Track' about their offers and whether they have been accepted from around 8:00am. They could also consider UCAS adjust if their grades are higher than their 1st choice offer and then look for a more prestigious university offering their course on the day. Also, on 'Clearing and Clearing Plus', there are relevant courses with vacancies that might be a good alternative if they did not get accepted on the courses they applied for. Information will be sent out via EduLink detailing these processes in preparation for the day.

How it will work:

- The students will be invited to select a 10 minute time-slot below from 8:45 am onwards
- They can collect their results with friends but group sizes will be limited to 15
- They must enter the Rainhill Sixth via the Sixth Form Entrance to collect their results from the Bistro
- They must then make their way into the Sixth Form Study Area to open their results
- Parents will need to wait outside but, if they would prefer, they can take their results out to open with you
- If they need to speak to a member of the Sixth Form Team about their next steps, they can come through to the Library to the Progression Hub to discuss their options. At this point, parents can be collected from outside and brought through to join the discussion

Your son or daughter must complete the following online survey shared via EduLink and Teams before Wednesday 21st July. Timeslots will be allocated on a first come, first served basis. Please be mindful that if your son/daughter arrives without booking a slot, you may have to wait longer if the timeslot is full. LIVERPOOL CITY REGION: ENVIRONMENT SURVEY

Please see the information about the LCR Survey on the Environment.

Children now are much more aware of global environmental issues as they are taught about them in school. The survey is being sent to all districts across the Liverpool City Region (Liverpool, Wirral, Sefton, Knowsley, St. Helens and Halton), and this will allow them to bring their school work to a local level with actions that themselves and their families take part in on a daily basis.

The survey will provide us with a baseline of knowledge that the children/young people possess, and will inform the educational programme for our Net Zero Carbon 2040 programme.

The questions are designed to provoke thinking and discussion around everyday activities that we need to change in order to reduce our Co2 emissions, they include the following topics:

- the food we eat
- the way we travel
- the way we cook
- the way we heat our homes

Results from the survey will be used to inform the First Year Action Plan on Climate Change.

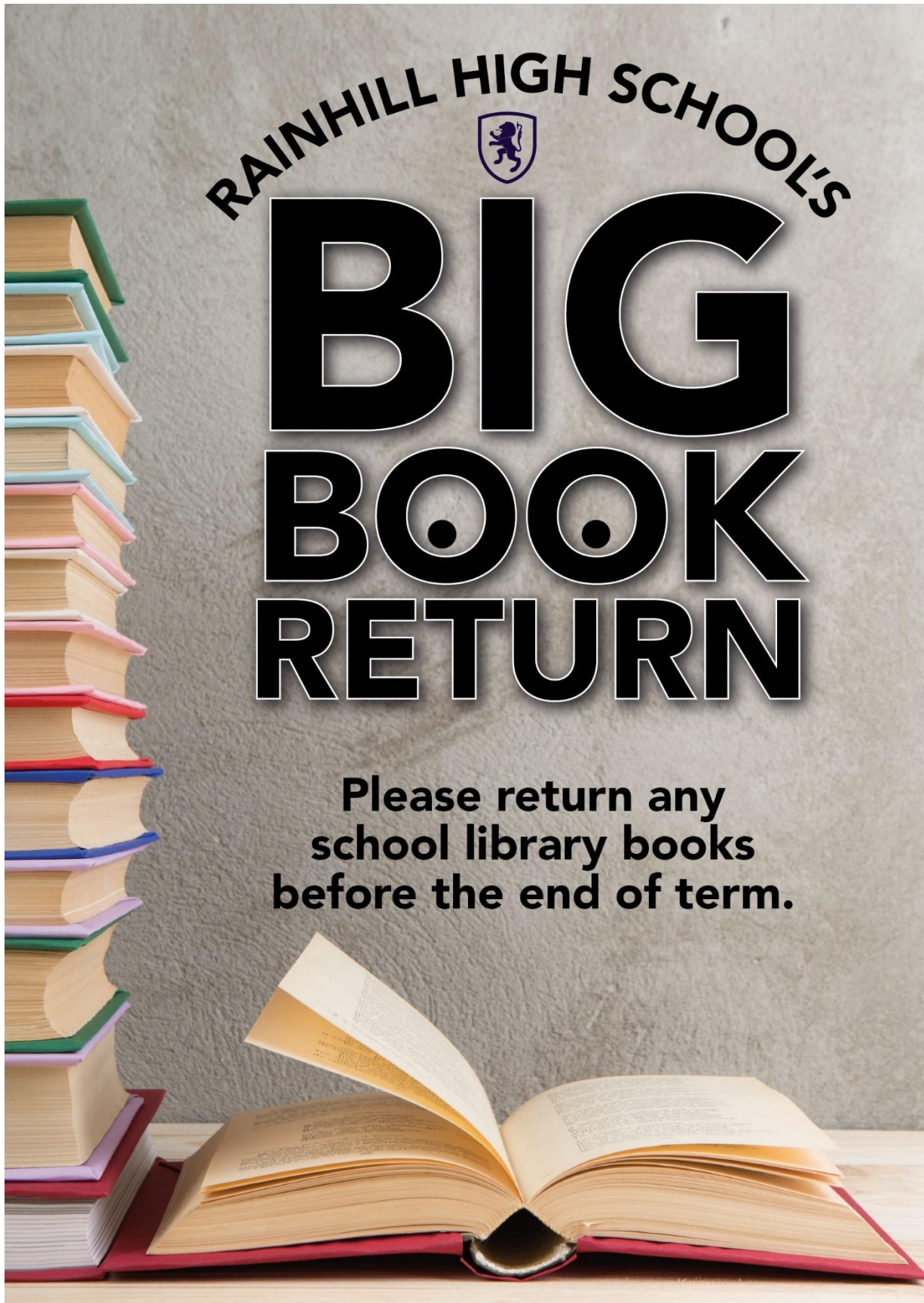

BASTILLE DAY 2021

THE BACKSTORY

- Bastille day dates all the way back to the French revolution during the late seventeen-hundreds - 1789.
- The French revolution established the way France is shaped and works today (more information in the "the French revolution" box).
- 'La Bastille' was a prison in Paris that held not only prisoners but artillery and gunpowder as well - the rebels needed gun-powder to make the armoury they had stolen work.
- So on the 14th of July 1789 the revolution stormed the Bastille setting free to all the prisoners, successfully gaining more artillery and setting fire / destroying the Bastille.
- All these events caused the famous French National Holiday - Bastille Day

THE FRENCH REVOLUTION

Definition / Official description - The French revolution was a period of fundamental, political and societal changes in France that began when the storming of the Bastille Prison in 1798, from when the revolution shaped France as we now know it.

Bastille day is hosted every July 14th 'juillet- quatorze' 'Fête nationale', which is celebrated by the Parisians marks the storming of the Bastille prison on July 14th 1789, and has commemorated as the birth of the French revolution,

the reason behind this is when a mob of French men were tired of the king's (the monarch's) rules, which they then stormed Bastille prison and gathered 'des armes' (weapons) and gun powder to then free all prisoners and then raised the monarch's, to then mark it's tenory they killed the royals, stuck their heads on spikes and paraded down the famous 'avenue des Champs-Élysées' which still proudly 230 years later the Parisians still parade down to celebrate France's success.



CORONAVIRUS INFORMATION AND GUIDANCE

FACEMASKS 10

The Government has updated its guidance regarding facemasks, which takes effect from Monday 17th May.

“From 17th May, in line with Step 3 of the roadmap, face coverings will no longer be recommended for pupils in classrooms or communal areas in all schools. Face coverings will also no longer be recommended for staff in classrooms. In all schools we continue to recommend that face coverings should be worn by staff and visitors in situations outside of classrooms where social distancing is not possible (for example, when moving around in corridors and communal areas).”

Regarding transport to and from school - *“Children and young people aged 11 and over must still wear a face covering on public transport. In accordance with advice from PHE, they must also wear a face covering when travelling on dedicated transport to secondary school or college. This does not apply to children and young people who are exempt from wearing face coverings.”*

COVID-19 TESTING

Dear Parent/Carer,

We continue to be encouraged to hear that the link between COVID infection and hospitalisation appears to have been broken by the vaccination drive, however we would nevertheless reiterate the **importance of continuing with twice weekly testing** and reporting the results of those tests via the process outlined later in this newsletter.

If you would like your child to be tested, by a trained member of staff, at school instead of at home then please email your child/children’s name and form to covid@rainhillhighschool.org.uk and let them know that testing takes place on a Monday and Thursday morning between 8:15am and 8:50am in our test centre (Gym). You do not need to await a confirmation email, once you have informed us you would like your child to be tested at school, then they may attend the test centre at the aforementioned times.

Please also note that the **Contact Testing** trial the school was participating in has now finished and therefore we have had to revert to asking positive cases, and ‘contacts’ identified in relation to positive cases, to self-isolate in accordance with the guidance below.

COVID-19 TESTING FOR STUDENTS

Testing of students

- Students should continue to self-test **twice per week** and follow the guidance below regarding reporting your result.
- If you would prefer your child’s testing to be done in school then please email covid@rainhillhighschool.org.uk starting their name and form.
- Comprehensive guidance on self-testing is contained in the ‘Instructions for Use’ leaflet, which comes with the test kit.
- LFD test kits for students will be replenished every 3 x weeks – they will be handed out in form time and should only be used by the student they are handed to; family members are able to get test kits from local testing centres and pharmacies.



RESULTS OF LFD COVID TEST

If negative –

You need to report the outcome of the test via testregister.co.uk/login
You can continue to attend school (work).

If positive –

You need to report the outcome of the test via testregister.co.uk/login

You will need to inform school and self-isolate in line with the stay-at-home guidance.

- **The person who has COVID** – isolates for 10 days starting the day after symptoms started or, in the absence of symptoms, the day after the positive test.
- **Non-Household ‘Contacts’** – isolates for 10 x days starting the day after the last time the person was in contact with the ‘infected person’ during their infectious period.

You will also need to arrange a polymerase chain reaction (PCR) test to confirm the result. If this PCR test result is negative, and you have no symptoms of COVID-19, you and your household can stop isolating.

The Government has released new guidance regarding what Parents/Careers need to know concerning the approach to COVID in schools from Step 4 (19/07/21).

The main points to note are:

From Monday 19th July onwards:

- We will no longer trace close contacts, however close contacts will still be identified via NHS Test and Trace
- Your child does not need to remain in a consistent group (“bubble”)
- The government is removing the requirement to wear face coverings in law but expects and recommends that they are worn in enclosed and crowded spaces where you may come into contact with people you don’t normally meet

From 16th August onwards:

- Children under the age of 18 years old will no longer be required to self-isolate if they are contacted by NHS Test and Trace as a close contact of a positive COVID-19 case. Instead, children will be contacted by NHS Test and Trace, informed they have been in close contact with a positive case and advised to take a PCR test

Other points to note from the guidance:

- Nationally, education and childcare settings are open, and attendance is mandatory
- The Royal College of Paediatrics and Child Health has made it clear that the overwhelming majority of children and young people still have no symptoms or very mild illness only, in relation to COVID
- Over the summer, staff, secondary pupils and college students should continue to test regularly if they are attending settings that remain open
- Secondary schools and colleges have been asked to prepare for on-site testing at the beginning of the autumn term
- You may be eligible for a one-off Test and Trace Support Payment of £500 from your local authority if your child has been advised to self-isolate by the school – more details are contained with the guidance referenced below.

PARENT COLLECTION OF MOBILE PHONES

IMPORTANT NOTICE - SCHOOL UNIFORM REMINDER FOR DANCE

From Monday 14th June, **Year 9** students were allowed to come into school wearing PE kit on the days that they have **Dance** timetabled. This is due to a lack of changing facilities currently, and the need to wear kit for Dance lessons. However, there have been a number of issues arising. Please can you support us with this by ensuring that:

- Your child attends only in Rainhill PE kit; no branded or other sports wear is permitted.
- Your child only attends in Rainhill PE kit on the days when **DANCE** lessons are timetabled, not Drama or PE lessons.
- If a child does attend school in incorrect kit or in kit on a day when dance is not timetabled, parents will be contacted to drop off their school uniform for them to change back into.
